Mayor's Message



Summer is just around the corner and many of you are making plans to enjoy the great outdoors. With the price of oil at record levels (yet poised to come lower in the near term), I am glad Old Tappan has so much to offer right here at home. Whether it is our parks and recreation facilities, or our newly renovated clubhouse (The Champions Grill) at the Old Tappan Golf Course, there is ample opportunity to stay close to home and enjoy some of the finest facilities available in Bergen County. Our DPW, under the leadership of Artie Lake, continues to do a superlative job in getting our parks and facilities in top shape, while the golf course, under the management of Paul Parascondolo, has never looked better.

As we go to press, we've received disappointing news from Trenton and once again, small efficient communities, such as ours, are being unfairly singled out. Instead of being rewarded for their fiscal conservatism over the past 9 years, Old Tappan is being punished. Trenton is restoring a small portion of municipal aid to the State budget, however, some of the very best run boroughs in Bergen County are receiving absolutely nothing. Reason being; their population is under 10,000. Some of the nearby towns not receiving aid are Alpine, Closter, Haworth and Saddle River. I believe that this is discriminatory and just plain wrong. Return all the Aid to all the towns and reduce wasteful spending at the county and state level. It is just not working and the WORST is yet to come.

I wish I could share final news on the budget. However, the State has not completed its work and until it does, we cannot adopt a final budget. I was pleased to see some members of the legislature considering to cut the rebate program in whole or in part as I suggested back in April. Politically it is a difficult decision, but it is the most prudent way of beginning to put New Jersey's fiscal affairs in order. Recently, Former Governor Byrne stated that he started the program to return money that shouldn't have been collected. As Governor it was the best way to offset excessive collection of funds. It was never intended to continue indefinitely. It is time to stop collecting taxes only to return them. Let's stop the rebate program and take a close look at what we truly need and start taking steps in Trenton to change our ways and serve the people. The only way that we can change the thinking and actions at the state, county and local levels is by changing the leadership in November.

On a positive note, your Mayor and Council is aggressively seeking grant funds to continue to make important investments in our community and collect all the dollars we can to keep the municipal rate low while maintaining best in class services. Grants of over 1.3 million dollars are being prepared as we speak. If successful, we will have major investments continue in our open space and parks program, while improving upon our infrastructure, including street upgrades and repaving. As you may have read recently, the Mayor and Council have also applied for grant funds to install solar energy thereby reducing our need on public utilities and reducing our short and long term costs. The funds are being sought, yet no commitment has been made by the borough as we will carefully evaluate this major undertaking and work to be sure the opportunities will bring measurable benefits to us.

Additionally, we will continue to work to find opportunities to improve services and reduce

costs. We are evaluating several proposals at this time and hope to have more information to provide to you in the near future. Recently, the Borough of Old Tappan bid some of its road repaving, along with ten neighboring communities, saving 29 % of the cost by bidding as a cooperative.

With Spring now in the air, I remind you to get outside and enjoy the outdoors. Walk along the Old Tappan reservoir or in one of our several parks. It is a special time in our special little town. Let me know how you are doing and how the Council and I can make your Old Tappan even better. We invite you to attend our meetings and witness how your elected officials manage the affairs of the borough: positively, disciplined and in a totally transparent manner. Building permits provide the means for Code Officials to protect us by reducing the potential hazards of unsafe construction and therefore ensuring the public health, safety, and welfare of the Borough of Old Tappan. Some projects that require permits are: sheds, fences, driveways, sidewalks, landscaping (soil movement), etc. The Construction Official and Zoning Officer (Nick Pappas) are in charge of all property maintenance issues. If you are unsure if a permit is required, please call or email the building department.



Please make sure that your grass is kept at a reasonable height and your yard is well kept. Now that mosquito season is approaching, please be sure that there is no standing water on your property.



With spring finally arriving activities around all of the parks and school fields have also blossomed. It's great to see our children exercising, riding bikes and playing sports. But, this also means more traffic around these areas and the possibility of accidents. Please be aware of children on bicycles or crossing streets when driving near any park or school. **DO NOT** park in any **NO PARKING ZONE** for any amount of time as you may be the cause of someone getting hurt when you possibly block their vision or the vision of a driver approaching. If you need that first spot, come early. With the extended hours of daylight more activities are scheduled around the areas so please be careful.

All children under the age of 17 are required to wear helmets while riding a bicycle, skateboard or roller blades.



Parents are reminded that underage drinking will not be tolerated. Both State Law and Borough Ordinances prohibit drinking by minors on public and private property. Liability issues should be enough to make any parent think twice before allowing minors to drink in their homes. Giving a minor alcohol is like handing them a loaded gun. Don't Do IT!!

Reminders;

Handheld cell phones may not be used while driving a motor vehicle.

Wear your seatbelt at all times (as we want to encourage our upcoming drivers of the importance of passenger safety!)

Know what the GDL (Graduated Drivers License) provisions are and enforce them with new family drivers.

THE OLD TAPPAN MUNICIPAL ALLIANCE COMMITTEE

has been hard at work scheduling and coordinating programs for 2008. Old Tappan has received approval from the N.J. Governors Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse for additional grant funding for the years 2009 through 2011. These grant funds are provided by penalties incurred from drug-related offenses called Drug Enforcement and Demand Reduction funds.

The O.T. Municipal Alliance Committee is comprised of community members who develop the goals and objectives of the Alliance in our town. The purpose of the O.T. Municipal Alliance Program is to promote public awareness concerning alcoholism and drug abuse as well as determine problem solving strategies for our community's unique substance abuse & prevention needs for *all* ages. Prevention education activities and programs are developed and implemented at the municipal level with the goal of bringing awareness to and reducing alcohol and drug abuse. The grant funds allow the Committee to continue some of the successful programs of the past, and create an opportunity to develop some new programs.



The always successful **Senior Citizen Luncheon** was held on May 15th and included a two guest speakers. Emmy award winning Old Tappan resident, Roseanne Collette from News Channel 4 and our esteemed Sergeant Charles Anders were on hand to address the seniors on issues that affect the quality of their lives.

Next on the Alliance program is the TBD/CDW 4th to 5th Grade Transition Program is scheduled for the evening of Thursday, June 5th.

In order to achieve all of our objectives, the Committee also depends on community support. Keep a look out for the Mayor's Trophy Golf Outing which is our annual major fundraiser held some time in early September.

3rd quarter property taxes are due August 1, 2008 (pending approval of the State Budget)

Annual Deductions on Property Taxes: Senior Citizens: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowner's age 65 or older or disabled who meet certain income and residency requirements.

Veteran Deduction: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowners who are qualified war veterans and their surviving spouses.

Please inquire at the tax office about these property tax deductions.

Property Tax Relief Programs: The State of New Jersey has several property tax relief programs available, including tax deductions for eligible senior and veterans (or spouses of deceased veterans). These programs and their eligibility requirements are subject to change, so for the most up to date information, please log onto the State of New Jersey Department of Taxation website www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation.

collected balance. PNC's proposal of a 3% interest rate will net the borough, roughly, an additional \$200,000 for the year that it is guaranteed at that rate. Additionally, we are working towards allowing residents to pay taxes on-line, by credit card or by debit card. At the time of this writing, anticipated user fees for credit card payments have not yet been established.

????? Want to pay your taxes or other Borough fees by credit and/or debit card or ACH? These payment methods are being looked into by the Borough's Technology committee and Finance committee.

Effective June 1st, PNC Bank became the borough's new official financial institution. PNC's proposal, drawn from a variety of banks to handle the town's 18 active accounts, was selected for the services that it offers and for the high rate of interest paid on our daily collected balance.

News on our newly acquired Bonnabel Property...

A committee comprised of 14 residents including Mr. Bonnabel has met weekly to discuss what needs to be done to enhance the use of this natural setting. The committee has walked the property individually and as a group and their initial plans are to keep the property in its natural state with the addition of benches, cleared walking paths and some flowers.

On the property is a big sycamore tree about 200 years old. The committee has been informed that this particular sycamore might be in the big tree book of NJ.

Bonnabel is a beautiful and tranquil piece of land which offers residents a place to fish or just enjoy nature. Take a walk through and tell us what you think.



NOTICE: We have recently been having a problem with objects in the sanitary sewer system that do not belong there. We have had the following, items of clothing, mop heads, cleaning cloths, and rocks. These items have jammed and clogged pumps, requiring the removal and disassembly of pumps from 3 different pumping stations. This is a costly and time consuming situation that should be unnecessary, it could also require the replacement of a pump costing \$5000 or more. Disposing of such items is a violation of borough ordinance §198-5. You also chance causing a back up in your lateral or in the street main outside your house which then could have sewerage backing up into your basement. We would also like to remind you that it is also a violation to dump cooking grease and oils down the drain as well as the connection of sump pumps and gutters to the sanitary sewer system.

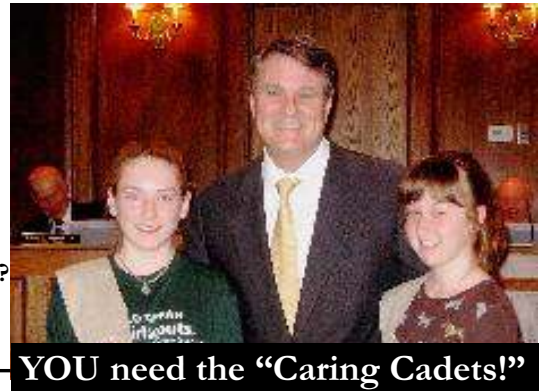

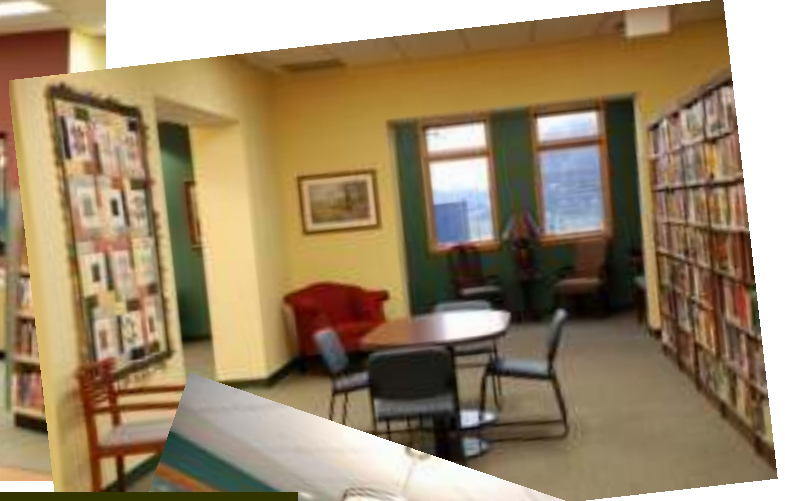

This overnight Relay, held at Westwood High School for the past four years, will now take place at beautiful Stone Point Park on Westwood Avenue in Old Tappan. Relay For Life will begin 5:00 p.m. on Friday, June 13th and will end 7:00 a.m. Saturday, June 14th.

Participants are welcome to arrive at 5pm to begin walking and enjoy the amusements, activities and entertainment. The Relay officially begins with a celebration of cancer survivors at the Opening Survivor Ceremony at 6:30pm. This emotional ceremony and first lap belongs to the guests of honor, the triumphant cancer survivors. All cancer survivors (anyone who has ever been diagnosed with cancer) are invited to walk or wheelchair a lap around the track while being cheered on for their courage and perseverance in facing cancer.

Fun-filled amusements take place throughout the evening such as a dunk tank, moonwalk, giant inflatable obstacle course and slide, foosball and ping-pong tables, clowns, a magician, arcade games, face painting, tattoos, hair braiding and more! These activities, along with lots of music, good food, basketball courts, baseball fields and a playground make Relay For Life a wonderful event for the whole family!

Participants can stay the night or leave, if they choose, at the conclusion of the Candle Lighting and Luminaria Ceremony which starts at 10pm and is the highlight of the event. It is held to honor cancer survivors and to remember those who have lost their battle against cancer. Dedicated Luminarias (decorated bags with small candles) are placed around the track lighting a path of hope. As darkness falls, the entire Relay comes to a stop. With bags glowing and candles burning, we honor cancer survivors, remember those we have lost and renew our pledge that someday we will rid the world of this disease and the suffering it causes. Everyone is invited to purchase a Luminaria bag in honor or memory of a love one.
