### Mayor's Message



Since the early 1980's, which encompasses both the Gallagher and Wiss administrations, your Mayor and council has worked very hard to keep our town safe, and our municipal taxes low (the only component of your tax liability that we are responsible for). Throughout this period, Old Tappan has been at the forefront of forming shared services agreements with neighboring communities because we collectively rec-

ognized early on that when times were troubling (like they are today), sharing with other municipalities will reduce our overall operating and capital expenditures. I mention this now, in light of our most recent agreement with Rivervale, and felt that it would be timely to discuss exactly what types of agreements Old Tappan currently has in place.

At a Pascack Valley Mayor's meeting a few months back, Mayor Blundo of Rivervale approached me about sharing the costs for our new skate board park. That discussion ultimately resulted in our towns splitting the costs of the park and at Town Day on September 13, 2008, Mayor Blundo and I shook hands on our cooperative venture. As we speak, children from both towns are happily using the facility. The idea for the skate board park has been worked on for a few years and we are proud to be sharing the costs, and enjoyment with our neighboring town.

Recently Old Tappan, in conjunction with the Pascack Valley Mayor's Association, created a purchasing cooperative. Over the past twelve months, we successfully bid on road work which reduced our costs by over 20%. We have also received a grant to study the ten DPW departments for the purpose of evaluation and shared opportunity. Other initiatives that are in progress are blanket energy purchases to mitigate our expenses, audit of hydrant costs, leaf and brush recycling, storm water management including pump stations, truck and auto washing, storm drain maintenance, cameras and specialized equipment. I am also working with the Northern Valley Mayor's Association to create similar opportunities over the next few years.

Additional shared services agreements that we have entered into are as follows: a senior bus, street sweeper, sewer jet and bucket truck with Hillsdale, whereby we allow each town to share one vehicle, some as part of a scheduled program and some on an as needed basis. We are now partnering with Northvale in a grant request for the Safe Routes to School program. Our long standing partnerships with Fire and First Aid continue through the mutual

aid program. Our Police dispatch is done with Rivervale, fuel is purchased through Bergen County, and our police department utilizes cooperative purchasing with other police agencies, purchasing supplies such as ammunition, flares and other agency supplies to reduce costs. We are also the fuel supplier to River Vale, Northern Valley Regional High School, River Vale Police Department and Charles DeWolf School, all the while ensuring that emergency service vehicles have a ready source of fuel thereby reducing the need for separate, costly pumping centers. Most recently Old Tappan, in conjunction with nine other towns, entered into a cooperative agreement with the county for a new sewer jet truck. This is a cost savings to us in excess of \$200,000.

Additionally, when you think about shared services, one of the first may have been BCCLS, The Bergen County Cooperative Library Service. Innovative in its time and now taken for granted, BCCLS makes every book available to any resident from any library in the system. We are blessed to have a blue chip facility staffed by extraordinary people at the library, under the outstanding leadership of Susan Meeske.

And lastly, you may recall the Resource Optimization Initiative we started with School Superintendent Bill Ward last year. Through ROI we assist the schools with maintenance and upkeep of their fields and machinery, as well as provide fuel for their vehicles, as stated previously. The borough and the school board are in the process of looking into energy audits to obtain real solutions to energy conservation. We are also in the process of exploring alternative energy production, including solar. Earlier this year, we applied for funds to conduct the solar energy study: we are still waiting for a response.

As you can imagine, the above mentioned agreements don't really "show up in the box score." Unless you see it and feel it, you really don't know that they exist, or that we are working on them. But they do exist, they have been and will continue to be an important part of this Mayor and Council's thinking.

As far as today's environment is concerned, hang in there as we will get through these unprecedented and very turbulent times that we are facing. Back in April when I wrote that the price of oil had peaked, I didn't expect that we would drop by 50%. So, stay positive, smell the roses and cherish all that we truly have.

Informed and reasoned decision making on the many critical issues before us can only be done with your input. The Mayor and Council need your help and support. ### A Message from Fire Chief and Fire Marshal Nicola Lepore....

This year the Old Tappan Fire Department ladies auxiliary celebrated its 75<sup>th</sup> year. I was surprised to find that a majority of our residents are unaware of this group and the service they perform for our Fire Fighters, emergency responders and ultimately the community.

As any Fire Chief knows at any large emergency there are many things to be concerned with and many responsibilities. A big responsibility is the good and welfare of our fire fighters and this is where our Ladies Auxiliary comes in.

The Ladies auxiliary is a volunteer organization made up of candidates who meet the eligibility requirements. The purpose of the ladies auxiliary is to promote a social atmosphere within the organization and to support the interests of the emergency service organizations.

The primary function of the Ladies Auxiliary is to be available to assist our emergency services with necessary refreshments when they respond to fire or any other serious emergency that may occur within our community.

A secondary function is to provide funds for donations to the New Jersey Burn Centers, the Firemen's home in Boonton, New Jersey as well as providing a scholarship each year to an eligible 8th grader in Charles DeWolf School.

The first meeting of the Ladies Auxiliary was held on August 16<sup>th</sup> 1933 at the home of the late Ida Stokes, with 24 members in attendance. The auxiliary purchased a gas stove and all equipment for the first firehouse kitchen, as well as donating \$1,969.20 to the firemen to build the fire house.



If anyone sixteen (16) years of age or older, who is related to an Old Tappan Fire Department members or Ladies Auxiliary member, or a resident of the community, is interested in becoming a member, the Ladies Auxiliary meets at 7:30 pm on the second Tuesday of each month downstairs in the fire house. You may also contact the Borough Hall at 201 664 1849 ext 227.

These dedicated ladies are a very important part of our fire service. These ladies come out to help us in all sorts of adverse and sometimes dangerous conditions. In good and bad weather hot days and cold days no matter what time of the day or night.

On behalf on our fire fighters and myself, a heartfelt THANK YOU, for your service and dedication to our fire service and Old Tappan's emergency services. We congratulate you on your 75th anniversary.

Since this is the last news letter of the year I would like to take this time to remind everyone of the following safety items:

- Change batteries in your smoke detectors when you change your clocks.
- If you have a wood burning fire place or stove, be sure to have the chimney cleaned and inspected for cracks before using them this season.
- Having your furnace and or boiler serviced before the heating season to ensure proper operation, this could be a source of carbon monoxide if not serviced properly.
- Be sure your homes have a clear and visible house number. If we cannot find your address we could waste precious time when responding to your home with a fire truck or ambulance.
- If you use a live Christmas tree this holiday season, be sure it is kept properly watered and in an area that would not block your exit in the event of a fire. Be sure all lights and wires are in good condition. Every year there are many house fires and fatalities due to carelessness with holiday decorations.

Santa Claus will be coming to town in December, keep an eye on the Fire Department sign for the exact date and time.

On behalf of the firefighters and officers of the Old Tappan Fire Department we would like to thank you all for your support this year. ### Old Tappan News



Property taxes are due on 11/1/08. There is a 10 day grace period to 11/10/08.

In early 2009 the tax office will begin accepting VISA and MASTERCARD debit and credit card transactions for a resident who <u>comes into the tax office</u> to pay their <u>current sewer service charge</u> due semi-annually on March 1st and September 1st.

We also will begin accepting in early 2009 VISA and MASTERCARD debit and credit card transactions for a resident who comes into the tax office to pay their <u>current annual special benefit assessment installment</u>.

These installments are due annually at different due dates throughout the year. If you decide to pay off the entire assessment, that must continue to be paid by cash or check.

During 2009 look for the online payment of real estate taxes, sewer service charges, and various other fees by ACH electronic check through a link on the Borough of Old Tappan's website <a href="https://www.oldtappan.net">www.oldtappan.net</a>.

Annual Deductions on Property Taxes:

Senior Citizens: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowner's age 65 or older or disabled who meet certain income and residency requirements.

Veteran Deduction: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowners who are qualified war veterans and their surviving spouses.

Please inquire at the tax office about these property tax deductions.


