Mayor's Message



Pince the early 1980's, which encompasses both the Gallagher and Wiss administrations, your Mayor and council has worked very hard to keep our town safe, and our municipal taxes low (the only

component of your tax liability that we are responsible for). Throughout this period, Old Tappan has been at the forefront of forming shared services agreements with neighboring communities because we collectively recognized early on that when times were troubling (like they are today), sharing with other municipalities will reduce our overall operating and capital expenditures.

Shared services agreements that we have entered into are as follows: a senior bus, street sweeper, and sewer jet and bucket truck with Hillsdale, whereby we allow each town to share one vehicle, some as part of a scheduled program and some on an as needed basis. We are partnering with Northvale in a grant request for the Safe Routes to School program. Our long standing partnerships with Fire and First Aid continue through the mutual aid program. Our Police dispatch is done with Rivervale, fuel is purchased through Bergen County, and our police department utilizes cooperative purchasing with other police agencies, purchasing supplies such as ammunition, flares and other agency supplies to reduce costs. We are also the fuel supplier to River Vale, Northern Valley Regional High School, River Vale Police Department and Charles DeWolf School, all the while ensuring that emergency service vehicles have a ready source of fuel thereby reducing the need for separate, costly pumping centers. Last year Old Tappan, in conjunction with nine other towns, entered into a cooperative agreement with the county for a new sewer jet truck. This is a cost savings to us in excess of \$200,000.

Additionally, when you think about shared services, one of the first may have been BCCLS, The Bergen County Cooperative Library Service. Innovative in its time and now taken for granted, BCCLS makes every book available to any resident from any library in the system. We are blessed to have a blue chip facility staffed by extraordinary people at the library, under the outstanding leadership of Susan Meeske.

And lastly, you may recall the Resource Optimization Initiative we started with School Superintendent Bill Ward a few years back. Through ROI we assist the schools with maintenance and upkeep of their fields and machinery, as well as provide fuel for their vehicles. The borough and the school board are in the process of looking into energy audits to obtain real solutions to energy conservation. We are also in the process of exploring alternative energy production, including solar.

As you can imagine, the above mentioned agreements don't really "show up in the box score." Unless you see it and feel it, you really don't know that they exist, or that we are working on them. But they do exist; they have been and will continue to be an important part of this Mayor and Council's thinking.

While minimizing taxes, preserving open space, and entering into intelligent shared services agreements are our primary objectives, we also must ensure that we continue to meet the demands of our residents for first class quality services. In each department of the borough, we strive for consistent service excellence. Every day our Police Department protects and serves our community admirably. Our Department of Public Works keeps our parks beautiful. Stone Point and Oakes Park are truly showcase parks!! Like every year, if you needed to drive on our roads after a snowstorm, our DPW seems to know how to clear roads and keep them clear better than any other town. The Old Tappan Golf Course is spectacular because of the expertise, work ethic and training of our Golf Course employees. And let's not forget Champion's Grill at the Golf Course; where consistently superb food is being served.

While other towns continue to struggle with providing emergency fire and medical services, our Fire Department and First Aid Corps are always at the ready to meet our emergency needs. The Council and I have provided the Borough Hall with state of the art technological tools to increase efficiency in the administration of the Borough, and the customer service focus of the Borough Hall employees is unparalleled. Across the board our Borough Departments, as well as our boards, committees and commissions, make the most out of each budget dollar while providing exemplary services. This is no accident as there is a conscious effort made on our part to make sure that we are doing everything possible to protect your greatest financial investment-your home.

As we approach the end of the fall and the holidays are right around the corner, this is truly a special time in our town. Let me know how you are doing and how the Council and I can make your Old Tappan even better. We invite you to attend our meetings and witness how your elected officials manage the affairs of the borough: positively, disciplined and in a

Property Taxes are due 11/1/09. There is a 10 day grace period until 11/10/09.

Property Taxes are due 2/1/10. There is a 10 day grace period until 2/10/10.

Sewer User fee is due 3/1/10. There is a 10 day grace period until 3/10/10.

The Tax Collector's office will now accept payment of the Sewer User fee and the annual installment of the your Special Assessment either by credit or debit card (VISA and MasterCard) in person at the Tax Collector's office.

Do we have your correct mailing address: Many tax bills as well as other important notices from the Tax Collector are returned by the Post Office as undeliverable. Property owners often neglect advising our office that their mailing address has changed. Please help us to keep our records up to date. Requests to change your mailing address must be submitted in writing.

Annual Deductions on Property Taxes:

Senior Citizens: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowner's age 65 or older or disabled who meet certain income and residency requirements.

Veteran Deduction: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowners who are qualified war veterans and their surviving spouses.

Please inquire at the tax office about these property tax deductions.

Just a reminder to all Property Owners that Old Tappan General Code Article 3 section 100-14 requires Certificate of Occupancy upon change of ownership or tenancy. (Commercial or Residential). Applications are available on-line or at Borough Hall.

This requirement ensures Building, Zoning and Fire Prevention compliance.

Message from your Department of Public Works Superintendant...

By the time you read this your DPW is getting ready for soon to be falling leaves. We have also discontinued our chipping schedule as of October 7th.

This brings us to leaf pickup. Leaves may not be placed in the street before October 6th this is due to local, state and federal stormwater regulations. The department will begin picking up leaves in the street on October 13th and continue until December 2nd. Please do not mix any debris such as branches, brush and rocks in the leaf piles. Rake the leaf piles as close to the curb as possible to insure safe passage of pedestrian and vehicle traffic. Do not place leaves within 10 feet catch basins or block fire hydrants. If you have a landscape contractor please inform them of the above-mentioned items, thank you.

Residents that have basketball backboards in the street are asked to remove them or turn them around, the borough will not be responsible for any damages that might occur. Thank you for you support in the past and your future cooperation.

As we have done in the past we will be recycling Christmas trees during the month of January 2010. We will pick up on the west side of town (Central Ave. to River Vale) on January 6^{th} & 20^{th} and the east side (Central Ave. to the state line including Central Ave.) January 13^{th} & 27^{th} . Branches will also be picked up at this time if time allows.

Did you know that most water pollution does not come from manufacturing and other commercial sources, but from runoff from our streets, parking lots, driveways and lawns. This is the reason that our federal, state and local governments have enacted certain laws and ordinances to protect our drinking water, these are know as the "Phase II Stormwater Regulations". Old Tappan is not alone in the ordinances and requirements that you have been reading about, most towns in New Jersey are required to have similar ordinances.

You may have noticed that most of the storm drains on the borough streets have had a label installed on them, this is part of the regulation and is to help remind us that what goes into these drains goes into our waterways. Virtually all of the storm drains in Old Tappan drain to the reservoir



right here in town or go to the Hackensack River, this is the source of our drinking water that is supplied to us by United Water. We all need to do our part to protect and improve our water quality for our future.

One ordinance that is required covers "yard waste" and the section that will directly impact us all deals with leaves and grass clippings that are not containerized. This would be during our leaf collection season specifically, for 2009 that would between October 13th and December 2nd. Leaves and grass may not be placed in the street more than 7 days prior to a pickup, so nothing can be place in the street before October 6, 2009. During the season we will make every attempt to give everyone a weekly pickup, please do not place leaves in the street immediately after yours have been picked up. Leaves and grass clippings must also be kept 10 feet from any storm drain. This is the only time of the year that you may place yard waste in the street for collection, at any other time it must be in a container that will be picked up by your garbage contractor. If you have a landscape contractor please advise them of the regulations.

Tire Recycling Computers/Electronics Program

Homeowners wishing to dispose of tires, computer or electronic equipment such as a TV, VCR, radios, etc, are invited to bring these materials to the following location:

Another of the required ordinances covers the storm drains and what can and cannot be allowed to drain or be placed in them. Besides stormwater some examples of other allowable discharges into storm drains are from basement and crawl space sump pumps, foundation and footing drains, residential car washing and swimming pool discharges (filter backwashing is not allowed), irrigation, sidewalk and driveway washing. There are some others but they are not related to residential discharges. Any other items are strictly prohibited including leaves, grass clippings and pet waste. This also includes items you expect such as paint, oil and other chemicals as well as soda cans and other floatable items that can harm wildlife in our waterways.

A Message from Our Police Chief...

With one of the wettest summers over with and starting into the fall season, I can only hope that winter will be mild with only small accumulations of snow. Just a reminder that there is No Overnight Parking permitted from 2 AM until 6 AM from November 15th until April 1st.

The schools are open now and a lot of activity is going on both during the daytime and evening, so please make an extra effort to slow down in the school zones regardless of the time of day that you are passing through. Stop for all school buses that are picking children up or risk a hefty fine and loss of license.

Parents are again asked to not block driveways nor come early to line up for children being discharged from the schools. It always seems that the first parent who lines up to pick up their child has the child that is always late coming out and therefore blocks up the entire street. Park a block or two away and drop off or pick up your children - exercise is good for all of us. There is No Parking within 25 feet of all intersections and 50 feet of any Stop Sign. Obey the School Marshals directions.

The Borough and the Old Tappan Police Department have recently signed on to a new community notification system called Nixle. You can now receive alerts, advisories, traffic, and community messages. This system allows you to choose the information you want to go to text or email or both at your choice. Go to www.nixle.com and check to see if you want to belong.

Residents with alarms systems are reminded that 2010 alarm registration and fees (\$20.00) are due at the beginning of the New Year. You will receive your notice in the mail. Please make sure all emergency contacts and phone numbers are updated.



Please be careful during Halloween for young children walking after dark and in the streets. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult after 8 PM on Cabbage Night and Halloween. Destruction of property will not be tolerated.

As always, please make adjustments to outside timers for lighting and trim or remove overgrown shrubbery around your house that may hide a potential burglar. Always let someone know when you will be away so that they can watch for suspicious persons who may be lurking in the area. Call the Police Department if you are going to be away for an extended amount of time. No one can replace keepsakes once they've been stolen. Keep alert! Keep safe!



PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE...

Stopping the Flu is up to you!!

The Old Tappan Board of Health is asking for your help to limit the number of people infected with the flu this fall. The best way to approach this is a two part plan, part one to avoid getting the flu, and part two to avoid spreading the flu.

Part 1

- Wash your hands several times a day. Using soap and warm water, scrub your hands for 20 seconds or one time through the ABC song. At the very least, wash your hands before eating and after using the bathroom.
- Keep your hands away from your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Avoid close contact with sick people. Try to keep at least 6 feet between you and the person who is ill.
- Get your seasonal flu shot. It will not protect you against the H1N1 flu but it will protect you from three strains of seasonal flu that are expected to be in the area this fall and spring.

Part 2

- Stay home if you are sick.
- Don't send your children to school if they are sick.
- Don't sneeze into your hands; instead sneeze into a tissue or your elbow. Make sure the tissue goes into a garbage can and you wash your hands as soon as possible.
- Wear a face mask if you can when around other people.
- If you are an employer, don't penalize your workers for staying home when they are sick or for staying home with their sick children.
- Make plans for what you would do if someone in your family gets sick.

If enough of us do these things, it should slow the spread of the flu and help us to reduce the total number of cases of the flu.
