Mayor's Message



believe that there is no more critical task for a governing body than the adoption of the budget. It is important to remember that the business of managing the Borough is truly a FINAN-CIAL one, and must always be looked upon from that perspective. Over the past eleven years, the overriding focus of this Mayor and Council has been to fashion a budget which is fiscally prudent within the overall context of managing our community. Goals such as preserving open space, investing in our infrastructure or providing our library with the necessary resources that they need to maintain their first class status are all viewed in the context of their present, and future financial implications. This administration has not, nor will we ever, compromise our long

term financial health for short term political gains.

The Council and I worked diligently together at numerous budget sessions during_January and February. In point of fact, this process started much earlier as I sent a letter in October to each department stating that its operating budget would be reduced by 5% from the previous year. The entire council and I met with our Auditor and senior staff in November to review 2010 and craft a responsible plan for the 2011 budget. We then reviewed every department request (including capital items which are needed to maintain our best in class services) and met with the heads of our various departments, boards, committees and commissions.

With the assistance of our Chief Financial Officer, Rebecca Overgaard, as well as our Municipal Accountant, Jeff Bliss we have put together a fiscally prudent budget for the year 2011. The result is an increase in the municipal portion of the tax rate for 2011 of \$91 annually (or \$7.58 per month) on an average assessed home of \$826,000. This increase in the municipal rate is caused in part by the reduction in interest income as short and long term rates hover around record lows, state mandated increases in pension costs, rising medical insurance costs, and higher utility and fuel costs (just look at your home heating bills and when you fill up your tank with gas). Finally, our "business first" approach has resulted in a bond rating that is now one notch below AAA, which is the second highest for municipalities in the Pascack and Northern Valley areas. This Mayor and Council will never use long term borrowing to support our day to day operating expenses. That is a recipe for financial Armageddon which would adversely affect your financial investment in this town.

At this time, we cannot project the overall tax rate for our community, as the local school, regional high school, and county budgets have yet to be finalized. However please remember that the municipal portion of the overall tax rate, which funds all Borough operations from the Police to the DPW to the Borough Hall, is only about 16% of the overall tax rate. The Old Tappan Board of Education, the Northern Valley Regional High School Board of Education, and the County of Bergen control approximately 84% of the overall tax rate.

The public hearing on the 2011 Municipal Budget is scheduled for Monday, May 2 at 7:30pm in the Council Chambers at Borough Hall. Please give us the benefit of your input. The proposed budget is available for your review on the "News" page of our website, www.oldtappan.net and is also available for review at Borough Hall. You may also email me your thoughts at mayor@oldtappan.net. Remember, our goal is to ensure that Old Tappan continues to be the extraordinary place it has always been, and that YOUR financial investment in this community is truly a profitable one.

I want to again thank the DPW, Police and all of our personnel for their extraordinary work thus far this year. Numerous major snowstorms have plagued havoc for our residents and they did an absolutely superb job during the entire time.

Thank you and let's enjoy our spring season in our beautiful town.

Property Taxes are due 5/1/11. There is a 10 day grace period until 5/10/11.

The Tax Collector's office accepts payment of <u>Sewer User fees</u> and the annual installment of your <u>Special Assessment</u> either by credit or debit card (VISA & MasterCard) in person at the Tax Collector's office.

2009 Homestead Benefit (Rebate). The deadline for filing 2009 applications was January 3, 2011. Eligible homeowners will receive their homestead benefit for 2009 as a credit on the property tax bill for the second quarter of 2011. A new tax bill for the May 2011 quarter will be sent to you by April 1, 2011.

2010 Homestead Benefit. Information about the 2010 Homestead Benefit Program is not yet available. Tenant rebates were suspended for 2009. As a result, no tenant rebate application is included in the 2010 NJ-1040 resident return packet.

2011 Tax bills should be sent out sometime in the beginning of July 2011 as soon as the tax rate is certified. These tax bills will be calculated using your new assessed value. The third quarter is due August 1, 2011

Local Annual Deductions on Property Taxes:

Senior Citizens: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowner's age 65 or older or disabled who meet certain income and residency requirements. Max income of \$10,000 after allowable deductions and exclusions.

Veteran Deduction: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowners who are qualified war veterans and their surviving spouses.

Please inquire at the tax office about these property tax deductions.

The Old Tappan Police Department in cooperation with The US Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) New Jersey Division would like to invite Old Tappan

residents to participate in this year's National Take Back Initiative, to be held on Saturday April 30, 2011, from 10:00 am – 2:00 pm. The location is Old Tappan Police Headquarters 21 Russell Avenue. The goal of the program is to allow the citizens of New Jersey to rid their homes of unused, unwanted, and expired medications by turning these medications in to law enforcement officials who can in turn dispose of these controlled substances in a safe and non-hazardous manner preventing pills from falling into the hands of juveniles or into the illicit market in our communities.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration's National Survey on Drug Use and Health, more than seven million Americans currently abuse prescription drugs. Each day approximately 2,500 teens use prescription drugs to get high for the first time according to the Partnership for a Drug Free America. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including the home medicine cabinet.

Clean Out and Dispose of Your Old Medications

At least once a year, you should check the labels on all of your medications. Medications that are past their expiration date, that have a change in color, smell, texture, or medicines that you are no longer taking should be disposed of properly. Expired medications may not work as well for you, or may even be harmful. **Do not flush drugs down the toilet.** Studies show that pharmaceutical waste is now present in our drinking water and harms our environment. Unfortunately, there are no waste treatment plants in the United States that are engineered to remove drugs from sewage. Again, **do not flush drugs down the toilet.** Pharmacies and county hazardous waste agencies sponsor take back programs where you can bring unused medication. Please consider disposing them at the Police Dept. on April 30th between the hours of 10am-2pm.


Free Home Medical Equipment Available

AARP DRIVER SAFETY PROGRAM

The Old Tappan Senior Citizens Advisory Committee is sponsoring an AARP Driver Safety Program on May 2nd. This is a one-day classroom refresher that can help you learn the effects of aging on driving and how you can adjust your driving to compensate for changes. As we all put a few more miles in the rear view mirror, it seems more and more has changed when it comes to our cars and the rules of the road. Familiar streets and road signs we used to know like the backs of our hands have changed to accommodate more cars and faster traffic. But it's not just our cars or the streets that have changed. So have we. Age-related changes such as reaction times, medical conditions affecting the heart, eyes, muscles, and brain, and the medicines used to treat those symptoms—can all affect our fitness to drive. With these changes in mind, it's good to review the elements of safe driving periodically so you can remain safe and confident behind the wheel. The AARP Driver Safety Program helps us do just that. It's designed to give you a chance to update your driving skills to respond to changes in yourself, your vehicle and the roads.

The Driver Safety Class will be held on Monday, May 2, 2011 from 9:30 AM to 4:00 PM in the Old Tappan Firehouse located at 227 Old Tappan Road, Old Tappan, NJ. There is no driving or scored testing involved. Current class fees are \$14.00 (\$12.00 for AARP members) payable by check only on the day of the class. The class is open to all New Jersey residents and is limited to 25 attendees. You will receive a certificate of completion after attending the course. Presenting this certificate to your insurance agent can often result in a reduction in your premiums which is good for three years. The class includes a 30-minute break for lunch. Attendees are urged to bring a bag lunch; coffee and cookies will be provided.
