Important Information For the 2011 Elections from the Office of the Borough Clerk

**GENERAL ELECTION:** Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup> – 6:am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the General Election is Tue., October 18<sup>th</sup>. Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., Oct. 18<sup>th</sup> until 9 pm

The Bergen County Board of Elections issues voter Registration Cards. If you are going to be out of town on Election Day, you may pick up an

absentee ballot application at the Borough Clerk's Office. The <u>County Clerk</u> must receive applications by mail no later than 7 days prior to Election Day. <u>After the 7 day deadline all applications must be hand delivered to the County Clerk</u>.

**DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES:** Watch for your Sample Ballot, which indicates your District and Polling Place in the left hand corner. Contact the Municipal Clerks office at 201-664-1849 ext. 14 if you have any questions.

#### Property Taxes are due 8/1/11. There is a 10 day grace period until 8/10/11.

<u>2011 Tax Bills</u> should be sent out sometime in the beginning of July 2011 as soon as the tax rate is certified. These tax bills will be calculated using your new assessed value. The third quarter is due August 1, 2011. There is a 10 day grace period until August 10, 2011.

#### State Administered Annual Deductions on Property Taxes:

**2010 Homestead Benefit.** Applications were mailed on June 7, 2011. Eligible homeowners will receive their 2010 Homestead Benefit as a credit on their 2012 tax bill. The deadline to file is October 31, 2011. For more information call the Homestead Benefit hotline 1-888-238-1233 or view online at www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation/2009homesteadinfo.shtml. 2010 Property Tax Reimbursement Program. The Property Tax Reimbursement Program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for property tax increases. The amount of the reimbursement is the difference between the amount of property taxes that were due and paid for the "base year" (the first year that you met all the eligibility requirements) and the amount due and paid for the current year for which you are applying for the reimbursement, provided the amount paid for the current year was greater. You must meet all the eligibility requirements for the base year and for each succeeding year, up to and including the current year to qualify for the reimbursement. The deadline to file has been extended to October 31, 2011. Call the Property Tax Reimbursement Hotline at 1-800-882-6597 for assistance or online at http://www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation/propfrez.shtml.

Residents who receive homestead benefits and/or property tax credits or deductions may also receive the property tax reimbursement if they meet the eligibility requirements. However, the total of all property tax relief benefits that you receive (property tax reimbursement, homestead benefit, property tax deduction for senior citizens/disabled persons, and property tax deduction for veterans) cannot exceed the amount of property taxes (or rent/mobile home park site fees constituting property taxes) paid on your principal residence for the same year.

Under New Jersey law, if an applicant receives a property tax reimbursement that is larger than the amount for which they are eligible, the applicant will be required to repay any excess received. The amount owed can be deducted from any property tax reimbursement, income tax refund or credit, or homestead benefit before the payment is issued.

Under the terms of the proposed State Budget for FY 2012, only those applicants who received a reimbursement check for 2009 and whose income for 2010 does not exceed last year's income limit of \$70,000 would be eligible to receive a reimbursement for 2010, provided they met all the other program requirements. For eligible applicants, reimbursements for tax year 2010 (to be paid in 2011) cannot exceed the 2009 reimbursement amount approved for payment. The Division of Taxation will continue to accept 2010 applications from residents who either did not file a 2009 application, or who filed an application for 2009 that was not approved for payment. However, if enacted, the proposed budgetary changes would limit 2010 reimbursements to those who filed a 2009 application that was approved for a reimbursement and whose 2010 income was \$70,000 or less.

All property tax relief program information provided here is based on current law and is subject to change.

#### Local Annual Deductions on Property Taxes:

Senior Citizens: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowner's age 65 or older or disabled who meet certain income and residency requirements.

Veteran Deduction: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowners who are qualified war veterans and their surviving spouses.

#### A message from your DPW Superintendant...

By the time you read this you may have already been aware that PSE&G will be in our service area trimming trees that are in proximity of their electrical lines. PSE&G is using Lewis Tree Service Inc. as their contractor to do this work, so you may see representatives from both companies in the area while this work is in progress. This work is to maintain the reliability of their network, especially during storms when tree branches may contact the lines causing outages. Borough representatives have met with Lewis Tree Service to let them know of our expectations of the work to be done and to minimize our concerns and that of our residents. They will be trimming trees along the roadway that have the potential to interfere with their power lines; it should not include the service to your house. PSE&G has the right to maintain certain clearances between their wires and the trees and will making the effort to maintain this clearance and trim the tree properly. #### News from the Environmental Commission...

The Old Tappan Environmental Commission welcomes its two newest members, Larry Weil and Melanie Rie. Both heeded the call for Commission volunteers and contacted Borough Administrator Pat O'Brien for details. The Commission is extremely happy with their appointments and we all look forward to a very productive year in guiding Old Tappan towards a more sustainable future. The Commission continues to seek community input in environmental related actions, so if you have an interest in playing a role in Old Tappan's green future, please contact Mr. O'Brien at Borough Hall.

**Earth Day Observances**: Led by Environmental Commission Member Bill Howe, Old Tappan Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts were galvanized into action to perform clean-ups at four Borough properties including Stone Point Park, Stanaland Park, the DPW Leaf Dump and Bonnabel Park. Armed with heavy duty gloves and trash bags provided by the DPW, the highly motivated scouts scoured each property and collected an assortment of litter, trash and debris that had accumulated over the years. One onlooker observed that almost two hundred bags of garbage were col-

lected. Many thanks to the scouts for the "kid-power" used to make Old Tappan a cleaner place.

**Solar Power Project**: The panels are up and by the time you read this, they'll be operational on Phase I, the Borough Hall and the Fire House. Final tests on Phase II (Police Station and DPW) are scheduled for mid August and if everything goes as planned, all buildings will be running on solar power. It's expected the panels will generate enough energy to not-only power these buildings, but also to generate surplus energy that the Borough will "sell-back" to PSE&G and Rockland Electric. Capital funding for the project was made possible through a State grant.

**Bonnabel Park Dedication**: Located at Lachmund's Bend on Old Tappan Road, this newest Borough Park will be dedicated this fall. Dedication ceremonies and activities are still being planned.

Old Tappan applies for *Sustainable Jersey* Certification: With Environmental Commission support, the Old Tappan Green Team submitted an application to *Sustainable Jersey* seeking an upgrade from our current status as 'registered' to 'certified'. To submit the required documentation, Green Team members worked feverishly over the past months to record and document all Borough initiatives, resolutions and policies that have goals of improving the quality of our environment. The formal application was submitted in late May. The Green Team expects the results of the application to be released sometime this summer.

The Commission also takes this opportunity to remind all residents to think and practice "Green" this summer. Look to the Borough website to see a list of monthly "Green Tips" that you can adopt for home, school and office. And remember to recycle, compost, conserve, walk......little things we all can do to help our community, our wallets and ourselves.

#### Lyme disease

Lyme disease is caused by a bacterium that is transmitted to humans through tick bites. Typically in our area, ticks that carry Lyme disease are known as black-legged ticks or deer ticks. Reducing exposure to ticks is the best defense against Lyme disease, and there are precautions that can be taken to stay protected. Avoiding areas where are a lot of ticks is a good place to start. Wooded, bushy areas are where ticks are most commonly found; especially during the months of May, June and July, when Lyme disease carrying ticks are most active. If faced with a tick infested area, be sure to stay in the center of a clear path or trail, and avoid any contact of overgrown grass, brush or leaves. To keep ticks off of skin, the use of insect repellent containing DEET should be applied on any exposed skin or clothing. It is also helpful to cover up as much as possible with long pants, sleeves and socks. Be sure to check your skin and clothing for ticks every day, especially after being outside.

If a tick is found attached to the skin, be sure to monitor your health closely, and be alert of any symptoms of tick-borne illness. Symptoms can vary from one person to another, but one of the first and most common signs of Lyme disease is circular rash which occurs around the site of the tick bite. The rash often appears 3 to 30 days after the bite. A few other common symptoms are fatigue, chills, fever, headache, muscle and joint pain, and swollen lymph nodes. If any of these symptoms develop, it is important to immediately consult with a health care provider for proper diagnoses and treatment. Early treatment of the disease can result in a full recovery. If left untreated, the disease can progress and spread to other parts of the body, causing more serious complications.

In most cases, Lyme disease, if treated early, can be cured within a few weeks using an antibiotic. Few people, usually who are treated later, may suffer from more persistent and recurrent symptoms, which require longer treatment. Ultimately, it is important to be aware of surroundings, regularly check for ticks, and to monitor your health and seek medical attention if faced with a tick hite




