A Message from Mayor Polce



Spring is finally here and we can look forward to having an outstanding summer. I hope that everyone in our community will take advantage of all the wonderful things this great town has to offer.

Since the end of last year, your Mayor and Council has had many budget meetings with the various borough departments to craft a budget with a minimal tax increase while continuing to provide the best in class services that our residents have come to expect. On April 20, the 2015 annual budget was adopted by the Mayor and Council, reflecting an overall operating budget increase of \$169,984 from 2014, or an increase of 1.89%. The largest increase in our budget this year was for unfunded deferred charges of \$240,000, which was approved in conjunction with this year's capital projects. As you may have read in the Bergen Record, the 2015 budget will provide funding of certain capital projects in

advance of issuing permanent debt later in the year. The Governing Body wants to take advantage of the historically low interest rates on bonds given the current financial situation and the Borough's AAA rating from Standard and Poor's. Additionally, the Borough completed a Bond refunding last year and DECREASED debt service in 2015 by \$33,931.

For the past several years, the Fire Department has requested a new Ladder Truck to replace the 30 year old Ladder Truck they currently use. After much deliberation, the Mayor and Council finally approved this purchase for \$970,000. The Mayor and Council also approved \$1,064,000 to undertake much needed infrastructure improvements to our municipal roads, sidewalks, curbs and drainage, looking to further improve upon pedestrian safety. Other projects approved totaling \$370,000 for the Police Department (vehicle equipment, electronic fingerprint system, and computers), Department of Public Works (multi-use tractor, leaf collector, and asphalt patcher), First Aid Corps (DeFib equipment), Fire Department (SCBA, turnout gear, and personal safety devices), Golf Course (greens mower and pond aerator), Administration (improvements to public buildings and property) and computers for the Borough offices.

In next year's budget, the 2015 appropriation for unfunded deferred charges of \$240,000 will be replaced by an equal amount for debt service required to repay the principal and interest on the proposed bonds thereby stabilizing the debt service portion of the tax rate.

Given all of this, the 2015 municipal tax rate increase will be \$107 on a home assessed at \$822,000. This reflects a decrease of \$8 for normal operating expenses and an increase of \$115 to provide the funding on all our capital projects this year. Collectively, we feel that it's a small price to pay for continuing to improve upon our infrastructure while providing our departments with what they need, before they need it. The Borough of Old Tappan still has the second lowest municipal tax rate in Bergen County and we hope someday to be number one, as our goal is to have the lowest municipal tax rate, with best in class services.

I want to thank our DPW for doing an incredible job this past winter under absolutely harsh circumstances. Not only did they keep our roads clear and safe but also managed to get the Borough ready for the spring and summer season. All our buildings are in great shape and our fields and recreation facilities look fabulous. Special thanks to the Police and Fire Departments, and our Ambulance Corps for their extraordinary efforts in getting us through the winter as well. As always, it is a team effort. Recreation is looking forward to another summer of baseball and basketball and their summer camp is once again going to be very busy. The Arts



GENERAL ELECTION: Tuesday, Nov. 3rd 6:am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the General Election is Tue., October 13th. Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., Oct. 13th until 9 pm. The Bergen County Board of Elections issues voter Registration Cards.

If you are going to be out of town on Election Day, you may pick up an absentee ballot application at the Borough Clerk's Office. The County <u>Clerk</u> must receive applications by mail no later than 7 days prior to Election Day. <u>After the 7 day deadline all applications must be</u> hand delivered to the County Clerk no later then 3pm the day before the election.

DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES: Watch for your Sample Ballot, which indicates your District and Polling Place in the left hand corner. Contact the Municipal Clerks office at 201-664-1849 ext. 14 if you have any questions.

Property taxes are due 8/1/15 unless we do not have a certified tax rate by then.

There is a 10 day grace period until 8/10/15.

***If the 2015 tax bills are not sent out on time due to the fact that the tax rate has not been struck by the County of Bergen you will be notified of the new due date.

Sewer User fee is due 9/1/15. There is a 10 day grace period to 9/10/15.

A NEW BILL FOR 9/1/15 WILL NOT BE SENT. THE BILL SENT IN FEBRUARY HAS TWO STUBS FOR THE ENTIRE YEAR.

Sign up for our Direct Withdrawal ACH bank draft program for your tax and/or sewer payment. Please check our website for application form and details.

Special Assessment Bills: For those who pay an annual special assessment those will be mailed out 30 days prior to the due date which varies depending on your assessment area.

Property Tax Reimbursement Program (Senior Freeze)

Eligibility requirements, including income limits, and benefits available under this program are subject to change by the State Budget.

Note: For 2013 the State Budget limited reimbursement payments to certain applicants. Only those applicants whose 2012 income did not exceed \$82,880 and whose 2013 income did not exceed \$70,000 were eligible to receive reimbursement payments for 2013, provided they met all the other program requirements. The State Budget may apply similar limitations for 2014. Application must be filed by June 1, 2015.

Understanding the Municipal Portion of your Property taxes...

The Municipal portion of your total tax bill is .15 on the dollar. This portion covers:

- Public Safety; Police, Fire and Ambulance service. This includes not only salaries for the PD but also the building services utilized, the equipment they need to do their jobs including Fire engines, heavy rescue vehicles, two ambulances, police vehicles and all-terrain vehicles, extensive radio systems, training, safety equipment and tools to perform their vital functions.
- Department of Public Works; DPW staff, the DPW complex, and the road equipment to maintain our streets, parks, roads, open space. The recreation facilities at Stone Point Park, the beautiful Oakes Park, Stanaland Park, Bonnabel nature preserve, Gallagher Field, Chestnut Park, and our magnificent 60 acre golf course.
- Borough Hall; the entire Borough staff, finance, tax collection, purchasing, payroll, Registrar, Borough Administrator and Clerk, Tax Assessor, zoning, construction, engineering, legal, Land Use Planning/zoning board, Court, Social Services. The staff does all it can to be professional and serve the residents and live up to the motto of "Just Make 'Em Leave Smiling". In addition to the infrastructure required including computers, software, training, website development, newsletter, information board it also supports the various commissions and their efforts including the Health Department and the Board of Health, Environmental Commission, Green Team, Golf Commission, Recreation and the Golf Course.




The Joint Insurance Fund honored the Borough of Old Tappan for its exemplary Safety record. The Borough of Old Tappan received the Silver award for its overall Safety program and success. A special award was issued for three years without a loss time accident. This prestigious award was issued for the first time ever.

- And also pays for those mundane bills you might not think of, electric, gas water, fuel for vehicles and heat, insurance. Did you know that the cost of having the fire hydrants available is now \$122,800 per year, even if you don't use water. Like all businesses we are also impacted by costs for Health insurance and pension costs.

While we try each year to do our best to keep your services at the highest level, we are also mindful how difficult times are and have been. So each expense is measured against value, and every request is given serious consideration for cost verses absolute need to come to a measured determination. Decisions can be very difficult.

Though the Borough of Old Tappan collects your taxes, the Mayor and Council only control the municipal portion of your overall taxes. The County Budget is adopted by the Freeholders and the Borough is assessed that cost, while the School budget is adopted by the respective Boards of Education, and the Borough is assessed that cost as well. At the same time we point with some pride that with .15 Old Tappan is heading into its third year with a AAA investment rating. We are told only six small towns in New Jersey can boast such a favorable rating. We will continue to try to earn it every day while making prudent decisions for the best interest of our entire community.

Longer Wait at the Tracks......

Next time you're stopped at the area railroad crossings, you may notice that trains transporting hazardous materials and Bakken crude oil are moving much slower. WATCH OUT FOR TICKS IN OLD TAPPAN

Lyme disease is transmitted to humans by the bite of infected ticks. It makes hundreds of thousands of Americans sick every year. Children are especially hard-hit by Lyme disease, with the highest incidence among children between 5 and 14. The disease does not appear to be transmissible between people, by other animals, or through food. Usually the tick must be attached for 36 to 48 hours before the bacteria are spread. Diagnosis is based on symptoms, physical findings (an expanding area of redness) and the possibility of exposure to infected ticks. About 25% of people do not develop a rash. Other early symptoms may include fever, headache, or feeling tired. Steps to prevent Lyme disease include using insect repellent, removing ticks promptly, applying pesticides and reducing tick habitat. Ticks can be removed using tweezers. If symptoms persist, go to your doctor. Most cases of Lyme disease can be treated successfully with a few weeks of antibiotics. If left untreated, infection can spread to joints, the heart, and the nervous system. There have been several cases of Lyme disease in Old Tappan, so: BE CAREFUL!!!



On March 16 Mayor Victor Polce swore-in the 10-member force known as Fire Police. The unit has the statutory authority to issue summonses and detain people when responding to an emergency situation, as well as other powers. According to state law, each fire police officer serves a five-year term.

The Old Tappan First Aid Corps (OTFAC) was founded in 1939, and is located at 4 Russell Ave - across the street from The OT Fire Department. As an all-volunteer independent emergency medical service we do not bill for services. Our funding is provided by your donations and supplemented by the borough. The OTFAC provides basic life support, and is staffed primarily by certified Emergency Medical Technicians. EMT training royided free in return for your service to your neighbors. We have two Type III ambulances and dispatching is

costs are provided free in return for your service to your neighbors. We have two Type III ambulances and dispatching is provided by the 9-1-1 call center at the River Vale Police Department. Our primary jurisdiction is the Borough of Old Tappan, but we regularly respond to requests for mutual aid from the neighboring First Aid Squads. OTFAC is a member of the New Jersey State First Aid Council, the Pascack Valley Volunteer Ambulance Association, and the Northern Valley Mutual Aid Group. The OTFAC offers you a way to give back to your community. We truly appreciate any contribution but our current need is EMTs and drivers available during the day. EMT training is available to you once you become a member at no cost to you. RNs, BSNs, & LPNs can achieve certification through a fast-track course followed by the NJ State exam. Message from Your Police Chief...

The OTPD would like to remind all motorists to exercise caution in and around the area of our schools especially during the time of opening, and dismissal of students. Please be aware of the presence of our School Crossing Guards and their important role for keeping the students safe. In April, a public safety message was sent to residents from the Old Tappan, Norwood, Northvale and Harrington Park Police Departments regarding news media reports of residents in a neighboring community being approached or interacting with Coyotes. A similar message was sent to parents/students of the NVRHS, CDW and TBD Schools. Residents are reminded not to approach a Coyote if observed within your general area. Individuals should make every effort to move away from the animal and contact the OTPD if the Coyote appears sick or aggressive. The general observation of a Coyote should not be cause for alarm. Coyotes live within the various woodlands throughout the community and have done so for many years. Children should advise an adult if they have seen any unfamiliar animal, including Coyotes, and request the adult contact the OTPD if that unfamiliar animal appears sick or aggressive. State Law and Borough Ordinance prohibit underage alcohol consumption on public and private property. 

We are excited to announce new features available to us through our library consortium BCCLS. The first is an online digital magazine database called Zinio that has 250 of the most popular magazines. Magazines can be downloaded to pc, tablet, iPad, iphone and more. Go to oldtappan.bccls.org and click on the Zinio banner. Second, is called Hoopla, a digital media service with over 200,000 movies, TV shows, music and audio books that you can download to any electronic device. Patrons are entitled to 8 checkouts (downloads) per month. Movie and TV content is available for 3 days, music for 7 days and audio books for 3 weeks. Plus no late fees. The download simply disappears. Go to https://www.hoopladigital.com/home. All you need is a library card to set up an account!


