COUNCILMAN RONALD BINAGHI, SR. passed on March 1, 2013. He was a lifelong resident as were his parents, grandparents and great grandparents. Ron was a farmer but he wore many hats in the Borough of Old Tappan. He was deputy marshal before there was a formal police department, animal control officer for 15 years, member of the OT Fire Dept. for almost 60 years, holding every rank and line office, attaining the rank of chief in 1966 and president in 1975. He was fire prevention chief for 15 years and past president of the Pascack Valley Fireman's association. He was a member of the first aid squad for over 43 years and very active on the day crew, night crew and any crew that needed him. Also a past president and trustee of the OT First Aid Corps. In the 70's, he was assistant building inspector and a member of the planning board. In 1982, he was elected to the town council where he went on to serve for 15 years. His love of Old Tappan really showed through in his tireless work on the council trying to make Old Tappan a better place for future generations. He had a no-nonsense approach to his job on the council and people usually appreciated the fact that he did not dance around any controversial issue. He called it like he saw it and he always had the good of the town on the top of the priority list. We remember Ron for his never ending love of his family, his beloved home town, and his love for his fellow man who he served so well.

PRIMARY ELECTION: Tuesday, June 4th 6am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the Primary Election is Tue., May 14th. The Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., May 14th until 9pm

GENERAL ELECTION: Tuesday, Nov. 5th 6:am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the General Election is Tue., October 15th. Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., Oct. 15th until 9 pm. The Bergen County Board of Elections issues voter Registration Cards.

If you are going to be out of town on Election Day, you may pick up an absentee ballot application at the Borough Clerk's Office. The **County Clerk** must receive applications by mail no later than 7 days prior to Election Day. **After the 7 day deadline all applications must be hand delivered to the County Clerk no later then 3pm the day before the election.**

DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES: Watch for your Sample Ballot, which indicates your District and Polling Place in the left hand corner. Contact the Municipal Clerks office at 201-664-1849 ext. 14 if you have any questions.

Property Taxes are due 8/1/13 unless we do not have a certified tax rate by then. There is a 10 day grace period until 8/12/13.

***If the 2013 tax bills are not sent out on time because the tax rate has not be struck by the County of Bergen you will be notified of the new due date.

***The **Homestead Benefit** will be applied to the August 1st tax quarter rather than the May tax quarter as stated in the previous newsletter. Depending on when the State of NJ sends us the payment file the credit may be applied to your 2013 annual tax bill or we may have to send out an adjusted tax bill that will show the credit.

Sewer User fee is due 9/1/13. There is a 10 day grace period to 9/10/13. **A NEW BILL FOR 9/1/13 WILL NOT BE SENT. THE BILL SENT IN FEBRUARY IS FOR THE ENTIRE YEAR.**

Sign up for our **Direct Withdrawal ACH** bank draft program for your tax and/or sewer payment. Please check our website for application form and details.

How to Apply for a Current Year (2012) Property Tax Reimbursement (Senior Freeze)

Eligibility requirements, including income limits, and benefits available under this program are subject to change by the State Budget.

Form PTR-1

Residents who were not eligible to apply for the 2011 reimbursement can apply for a 2012 reimbursement by completing and filing Form PTR-1. A copy of the 2011 and 2012 property tax bills and proof of payment must be submitted with the application. Mobile home owners must enclose documentation of annual site fees due and paid. To be eligible for the 2012 reimbursement an applicant must have been 65 years of age or older as of December 31, 2011, or receiving Federal Social Security disability benefits as of December 31, 2011, and December 31, 2012. Applicants 65 years of age or older must submit proof of age such as a copy of their birth certificate, driver's license, or church records. Applicants who are not 65 years of age or older but are receiving Federal Social Security disability benefits must submit a copy of the Social Security Award Letter indicating that the applicant was receiving benefits. An applicant does not qualify if receiving benefits on behalf of someone else. Applicants who satisfy all the 2012 Eligibility Requirements must file the 2012 Property Tax Reimbursement Application (Form PTR-1) on or before June 3, 2013.

Note: The format of the 2012 property tax reimbursement application has changed. Applicants must complete all four pages and sign the application on the last page. Read all instructions carefully. The method of reporting pension and retirement benefits (including IRA and annuity income) for property tax reimbursement purposes has changed as a result of a recent court decision.

Form PTR-2

Personalized applications (Form PTR-2) for a 2012 reimbursement are mailed to individuals who applied and were eligible for a 2011 reimbursement. This form is preprinted with some of the information provided on an applicant's base year application to make filing easier. These filers will only have to provide their 2012 income and property tax information. Eligible applicants must file the 2012 Property Tax Reimbursement Application (Form PTR-2) on or before June 3, 2013.

Note: The format of the 2012 property tax reimbursement application has changed. Applicants must complete all three pages and sign the application on the last page. Read all instructions carefully. The method of reporting pension and retirement benefits (including IRA and annuity income) for property tax reimbursement purposes has changed as a result of a recent court decision.

Verification Forms

Applicants who cannot locate their property tax bills or proof of the amount of property taxes (or mobile home site fees) paid may submit with the reimbursement application a verification form which has been completed and verified by their tax collector or the owner or manager of their mobile home park. Applicants filing Form PTR-1 will use the verification Form PTR-1A (homeowners) or PTR-1B (mobile home owners). Applicants filing Form PTR-2 will use the verification Form PTR-2A or PTR-2B.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS...

We have recently been having a problem with objects in the system that do not belong there. We have had the following; mop heads, cleaning cloths, "Swiffer" style cleaning These items have jammed and clogged pumps, removal and disassembly of pumps from 4 different stations. This is a costly and time consuming situation that unnecessary, it could also require the replacement of a pump or more. Disposing of such items is a violation of borough ordinance §198-5. You also chance causing a back up in your lateral or in the street main outside your house which then could have sewerage backing up into your basement. We would also like to remind you that it is also a violation to dump cooking grease and oils down the drain as well as the connection of sump pumps and gutters to the sanitary sewer system.

The recycling center is opened Monday thru Friday, 7:00 am until 3:00 pm, and from 9:00 am until 1:00 pm on Saturdays (except holidays). Please bring only those items designated for recycling and place them in the appropriate designated container, please do not place plastic bags in with your items. Please use the curbside pickup whenever possible to prevent an overflow situation at the DPW yard. This now includes consumer electronics effective 2011 you may not dispose of such items as trash. We do not accept garbage, construction debris, paint or chemicals etc. Violators will be prosecuted. If you have any questions as to what is acceptable or where you may dispose of items, please refer to your recycling bulletin or call 201- 664-4438.

The Old Tappan Board of Health continues to focus its intent, via the Mayor's Wellness Campaign, on implementing active lifestyle and healthy living initiatives for the enjoyment of all citizens of the Borough and beyond. The Old Tappan Board of Health and the American Academy of Pediatrics reminds you to wear a bicycle helmet every single time you ride a bike. Not only is it the safest and most effective way to prevent the 500 annual deaths from bicycle related head injuries that occur each year in this country, it's the law. Each year, 500 cyclists die of bicycle related head injuries, including from collisions with motor vehicles and falls. 153,000 children are treated in emergency rooms every year for bicycle related head injuries. Bicycle helmets safely and effectively prevent serious brain injuries by up to 88%, and decrease the risk of upper facial injuries by 65%. New Jersey law requires anyone under the age of 16 to wear a helmet. This law is enforced with increasing fines for each offense. Adults must serve as role models by wearing bicycle helmets. Teach your children to accept wearing helmets and maintain this life long health and safety habit. The American Academy of Pediatric advises all cyclists (children and parents alike) to wear helmets. Bicycling is a wonderful recreational aerobic activity and an environmentally clean method of transportation. The Old Tappan Board of Health plans to offer our community more information and resources to motivate you to stay safe, "use your head," and wear bicycle helmets.

LIBRARY NEWS...

Our library is making history! We are in the process of organizing the non-fiction collection by subjects rather than the Dewey Decimal System. We are the first library in New Jersey and one of the few in the nation to go "non-Dewey." Subject examples are "Body & Soul" where you'll find health, diet, religion, self-help and more. "Home" has everything from cooking to decorating to landscaping. The subjects are color coded and call numbers will list the subject, topics and author. Example: SOUL, SELF-HELP, MOTIVATION, SMI. Our purpose is to create a system for all of our customers that is user-friendly and easy to browse for books. The adult non-fiction section will be completed by the end of April and juvenile books will be finished by August.

Do you have a Kindle, Nook, iPad or other e-reader? Starting May 31st the library will be subscribing to an additional e-book database called BeAT for FREE downloadable e-books. In addition, free e-books are available on the BCCLS (Bergen County Cooperative Library System) website. Go to www.bccls.org and click on eBCCLS. A library card is required to set up an account.

GOLF COURSE REMAINS ASSET TO TOWN...

"Build It and They Will Come" In the movie "Field of Dreams", with Kevin Costner, the idea to build a field held the premise "Build It and They Will come". So it has been with the Old Tappan Golf Course. It is still somewhat interesting how many people say that they wanted to live in Old Tappan because of the town golf course. While Old Tappan has so many great features, the golf course has been yet another attraction for over 40 years.

How did a town the size of Old Tappan decide that a golf course would be a worthwhile and profitable venture? An answer to this question appears in articles written in local papers in the early 1970's. Around that time, the town was constantly endeavoring to find suitable recreational areas with a type of revenue service for the borough. As stated in an article, the recreation commission came up with the idea of a golf course. Golf had been growing in popularity and the idea of preserving acres of property was ecologically sound. In November of 1966, a proposal for a municipally owned and operated golf course was put to a vote of the residents on a non-binding referendum. It was approved by an overwhelming majority of townspeople who voted on the question. In 1966, Old Tappan was still pretty much a rural farmland with a population of about 3,500 people.


The residents had approved an estimated \$600,000 investment to be financed through the sale of bonds. The costs the purchase of the present 50 acres of farmland at \$7,500 per acre. This land dated back to a grant given to the Deby Queen Ann in 1704. In September of 1967, title was transferred to the Borough of Old Tappan and construction after. The par 35 course officially opened July 4, 1969 and was open for play on Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday.

Today as one moves around the golf course, the beauty of the property is evident when viewing the reservoir and woodlands. Paul Parascondolo, the golf course superintendent, has his crew working well to maintain and keep the usual great condition. Fairways and tees have been aerated, trees have been trimmed, and a general clean-up all place.

Adding to the beauty of the course is the occasional sighting of wildlife, which could include deer, fox, coyotes, and hawks, and herons. Also, a beautiful one acre pond enhances spectacular specimen trees such as crab apple and cherry trees.

Working along with Paul is the veteran Golf Pro, Doug Meeks, who is the welcoming Good Will Ambassador for Doug has been very busy enrolling new members for the current season. If anyone is interested in membership or Doug is the man to see. Stop by at the Pro Shop for further information.

It's interesting to note that Paul and Doug are both home grown Old Tappan products and therefore have even interest in the workings of the golf course. Both the Parascondolo and Meeks families go back a long way in the town. It is of further interest that our award winning restaurant, the Bouwerie, is also managed by two young people bred products. - Keith Roche and Dan DeMeglio. Keith's grandfather Fred Smith, was one of the original members of the Old Tappan Golf course dating back to 1969. Dan's family are long time residents in Old Tappan and have been in the community in many ways. The Bouwerie is now in its second year of operation. In addition to dining in a chef has featured a menu that includes fine steaks and seafood. The Bouwerie does a great job hosting and catering is provided on and off the premises.
